1. YACHTS PROCEEDING BETWEEN ST. GEORGE'S AND HAMILTON.

After finishing the race, and PRIOR TO ENTERING the ship channel proceeding to Hamilton, yachts are requested to contact Maritime Operations on **VHF Channel 16 or 27** to receive an update on shipping traffic.

The Swing Bridge at Ferry Reach is currently closed for the duration of 2016 for extensive repair work. All boats proceeding to Hamilton Harbour will need to sail around Fort St. Catherine and up the North Shore. IT IS STRONGLY RECOMMENDED THAT VESSELS CROSSING THE FINISH LINE AFTER DARK REMAIN IN ST. GEORGE'S HARBOUR UNTIL DAY LIGHT, SO AS NOT TO UNECESSARILY PUT AT RISK THE SAFETY OF THE VESSEL, THOSE ON BOARD AND EMERGENCY SERVICES PERSONNEL. Yachts entering St Georges Harbour at night shall anchor in the quarantine area to the south of the town identified on the charts as Powder Hole. They will remain under quarantine and crews must remain aboard until proceeding to HM Customs at RBYC in Hamilton at daybreak.

YACHTS TRANSITING THE CHANNELS AT NIGHT DO SO AT THEIR OWN RISK. ANY TOW ASSISTANCE REQUIRED, AND ASSOCIATED COSTS, DUE TO MECHANICAL PROBLEMS OR GROUNDING WILL BE THE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE VESSEL OWNER.

Vessels with serious mechanical, rigging or medical problems on-board that are unable to proceed to Hamilton in the normal manner should contact Maritime Operations for further guidance on H.M. Customs clearance.

2. ANCHORAGE/BERTHING AT RBYC

Yachts, when anchoring, are warned to be careful of the submarine cable between Albuoy's Point, the western end of White's Island and Hogdson's Ferry Landing. All yachts at anchor should berth, for their own safety, WELL CLEAR of the Main Ship Channel (making due allowances for Southerly winds) as outlined in the charts and, if their anchor berth is temporarily vacated, are recommended to leave a mark buoy.

The RBYC has reserved moorings in their marina for class winners and pre-arranged reservations. Yachts should contact the RBYC Marina Manager on VHF Channel 74 once they have passed through Two Rock Passage and are proceeding down Hamilton Harbour. The RHADC will monitor VHF Channel 73. The Finish Line Committee will monitor VHF Channel 72.

All vessels must have sufficient fenders, dock lines and anchor ready on arrival at RBYC. Please be patient when it comes to docking as the Marina Manager cannot be everywhere at once and will be working to get everyone docked as quickly and efficiently as possible.

It would be appreciated if yachts could fly dress colours and flags after berthing for the duration of their stay.

All boats are charged at the rate of \$4.50 per foot, per day, which includes water. Electricity use will be charged at \$25 per day. The RBYC Marina Manager, Reggie Horseman, will keep account on a daily basis of boats arriving and departing. A non-refundable deposit of \$250.00 will be deducted from the total berthing charges. All charges will be billed to the Visa or MasterCard you provided on your entry form. If the charges are not to be charged to the credit card number on your entry form, you must give the accounts office authorisation to charge another card. If, once you receive your credit card statement, you have a query with the charges; please contact Lorraine Bridges in the accounts office at accounts@rbyc.bm or 441-294-6707 or 441-295-2214 ext. 107.

Yachts intending to berth off the Hamilton Princess & Beach Club (Tel: 441-295-3000), or off the RHADC (Tel: 441-236-2250) are requested to inform their Dock Master well in advance. Owners and skippers of yachts using the facilities of Hamilton Harbour during Bermuda Race week are warned to expect heavy shipping traffic and to be guided accordingly.

3. ENTRY AT BERMUDA

PLEASE READ THESE PROCEDURES CAREFULLY AS THEY HAVE CHANGED SINCE THE 2014 RACE.

3.1 BERMUDA CLEARANCE PROCEEDURE

Racing crew: Bermuda Department of Border Control officers will be posted at [Race Headquarters in Newport](#) to provide pre-clearance services. In order to take advantage of this each individual crew member must apply in person with passport in hand (and return flight confirmation if applicable – see below), as well as the completed **Immigration Passenger form and Customs Traveler Declaration** (a single form may be presented for immediate family members sharing a common household). Skippers must also provide the completed Bermuda Customs Clearance and Additional Crew and Passenger list. All forms will be provided in Newport. **Pre-clearing will help avoid long waits to clear in at RBYC and put you closer to that first post-race Dark 'n Stormy. The Border Control officers will process and return all crew-forms to skippers (boat representative). Upon arrival in Bermuda these forms are to be presented to Border Control desk at the RBYC.**

Bermuda Department of Border Control Officers will be at registration in the Newport Pre Race Headquarters at the New York Yacht Club Harbour Court for pre clearance during the following dates and hours:

Tuesday 14 th June	8:30 am to 4:30 pm
Wednesday 15 th June	8:30 am to 4:30 pm
Thursday 16 th June	10:00 am to 8:00 pm

Racing crew returning by air: If you're racing to Bermuda but flying home, you'll need to present your return ticket, boarding pass or airline confirmation to Bermuda Department of Border Control during your in-person pre-clearance interview at Harbour Court. E-tickets are acceptable BUT documentary proof of ticket MUST be shown, i.e. printout showing Locator ID and confirmation of flight itinerary.

Return crew arriving by air: In order to clear Border Control at Bermuda's airport, you'll need a letter from your skipper confirming you're a part of the boat's return trip crew and an anticipated departure date. You'll also need your passport and a completed Bermuda Customs form (they are supplied by your airline, in flight).

Racing crew returning on a different boat: In these circumstances you'll also need a letter from your return boat skipper confirming you're a part of the boat's return trip crew and an anticipated departure date.

Immigration details

Proof of Citizenship and Identification

All travelers must carry with them proof of citizenship and personal identification (including government issued photo ID) relevant to a return to their own country or for re-entry through another foreign country, as required by Bermuda Immigration authorities. This applies to adults and children traveling alone or with their parents.

Visitors from the United States of America must present a valid, machine-readable U.S. passport. Persons born outside of the USA, who are landed immigrants in the USA, must be in possession of a valid, machine-readable passport in addition to their landed Immigrations Status card (green card)

Visitors from Canada must present a valid, machine-readable Canadian Passport. Citizens born outside of Canada who are landed immigrants in Canada must be in possession of a valid, machine-readable passport in addition to their landed Immigrations Status card. .

Visitors from the U.K. and Western Europe must present a valid, machine-readable passport from their country.

Whatever the visitor's country of origin, several things should be stressed:

- Driver's licenses are not acceptable as proof of citizenship.
- Foreign citizens not bearing one of the listed documents may be refused entry into Bermuda. Specific requirements can be obtained from your own Immigration Department.
- Neither Bermuda nor U.S. Immigration Authorities accept a notarised copy of birth certificate, or similar non-governmental document as proof of citizenship (must present a machine readable passport).
- Married women whose identification documents are in their maiden name, but who are traveling under their married name, should also carry their marriage certificate, or a certified copy, as further proof of identify.

All bona fide visitors are allowed to remain in Bermuda for an initial period determined by the admitting Immigration Officer (usually 90 days). An application to extend the length of stay for a yachtsman must be made in person, Monday through Friday from 9am to noon, at Immigration Headquarters in Hamilton, Tel: (441) 295-5151.

VISAS & VISA CONTROLLED NATIONALS (VCN)

With effect at March 1, 2014, **Bermuda entry visas and visa waivers are no longer required** for tourists. To be landed in Bermuda as a Visa Controlled National, the following requirements must be met:

1. .all travelers who require a multi re-entry visa (MRV) for the UK, US or Canada must present this visa-type upon application to land in Bermuda;
2. the MRV for the UK, US or Canada must be valid for 45 days beyond the expiration of a visitor's intended stay;
3. all travelers must possess a passport that is valid for 45 days past the expiration of their intended stay in Bermuda; and
4. arranged accommodation in Bermuda.

Persons whose MRV and passport validity is less than 45 days will not be landed.

Bottom line is the traveler does not need a Bermuda Entry visa but if a VCN arrives without a multiple re-entry visa (MRV) they will not be permitted to leave the vessel for departure by air, they will have to leave onboard that vessel and may be confined to that vessel until it departs Bermuda waters. Of course each case will be judged based on its merits.

3.2 BERMUDA CLEARANCE PROCEEDURE

Boarder Control Officers will be stationed in the Trophy Lounge at the RBYC. This office will be manned during the following periods:

Sunday 19 th June	To Be Determined as Required (contact Duty Desk for update)
Monday 20 th June	8 am to 9 pm
Tuesday 21 st June	8 am to 9 pm
Wednesday 22 nd June	8 am to 7 pm
Thursday 23 rd June	8 am to 4pm
Friday 24 th June	If required
Saturday 25 th June	8 am to 3 pm
Sunday 26 th June	8 am to 2 pm (may close earlier - to be announced)

On entering Bermuda, only the skipper needs to report to Border Control officers to submit, for him/herself and all other crew who have pre-cleared in Newport, the **Immigration Passenger forms and Customs Traveler Declarations for each, and the Bermuda Customs Clearance and Additional Crew and Passenger List AND the Declaration of Health for the yacht.** Crew that did not pre-clear in Newport must accompany their skipper to the Border Control Officers in Bermuda with their passport and all paperwork outlined above.

H.M. Customs' clearance is to be done at the RBYC and NOT at the Yacht Reporting Center in St. Georges.

Yachts must fly their Quarantine Flag until papers have been presented to H.M. Customs at the RBYC.

If any crew member has a contagious disease, the quarantine flag must remain hoisted and all crew members must remain aboard until a Medical Officer clears the yacht.

For those not using pre-clearance of Border Control formalities in Newport, the skipper will also have to present all crew members' Immigration Passenger Arrival forms and valid passports to the Customs Officers at the RBYC.

There are no Port charges as the customary passenger tax has been waived for the event. Documentation requirements are as for pre-clearance set out above.

Customs Clearance For Boats Berthed At RHADC

All yachts must clear H. M. Customs at RBYC. For yachts berthed at RHADC, please contact the RHADC Duty Desk to arrange transport to the RBYC for Customs Clearance.

4. BERMUDA DUTY DESK CHECK IN AND REQUIREMENTS

As per SI 13.2, skippers are reminded that the following must be handed in to the Duty Officers' Desk at the RBYC, after clearing Customs.

- a) Certificate of Compliance
- b) Tourism Survey
- c) Onboard Training Certificate signed by all participating crew. Yachts will not be scored without submissions of this document.
- d) YellowBrick Position Transponder: Boats will not be officially scored unless the tracker is turned in.
- e) Any protest or redress forms.

5. GENERAL SAFETY ISSUES & LOCAL ETIQUETTE

- The emergency number in Bermuda is **911**.
- Please remember that vehicles drive on the **LEFT** in Bermuda so please be careful when crossing the road and especially if you intend to rent a scooter during your stay.
- The speed limit is 20 mph/35kmh.
- **Please do not drink and drive** - the Duty Desk team will be happy to call you a taxi.
- Please use common sense with regard to your personal safety while in Bermuda - travel in groups wherever possible and do not carry large sums of cash or wear expensive jewelry.
- **BBQs are strictly forbidden in the marina.**
- Please do not go shirtless or shoeless whilst at RBYC or in other public places in Bermuda -this is considered acceptable only at the beach.

6. FIRE DRILL INSTRUCTIONS AT THE ROYAL BERMUDA YACHT CLUB

Call 911 if possible. If not, notify Maritime Operations VHF 16 - if it is necessary to abandon ship via the water, please notify Maritime Operations or 911 of this so marine emergency vessels can be put into action.

Sound horn in accordance with international marine regulations for an emergency - three short blows of the horn followed by one long blast.

If possible move boat away from dock. **DO NOT DO THIS IF THERE IS ANY POSSIBILITY OF SERIOUS INJURY.**

911 OR Maritime Operations will contact Fire, Police, and RBYC General Manager David Furtado or Marina Manager Reggie Horseman. They will then notify official parties.

ALL Occupants on the dock are required to evacuate the premises in the event of a fire in the marina or Club. There are two possible assembly points:

- Barr's Bay Park if wind is from the North through West.
- Albouy's Point if wind is from the South through NE.

Skippers are responsible for each of their crew and the assembly thereof. Skippers should report to the Emergency Coordinator who is identified by his/her vest and flag. Only the Emergency Coordinator will correspond with the Police and Bermuda Fire Service.

7. DUTY OFFICERS

- a) RBYC Duty Officers will be stationed at the Club to assist you with any inquiries on Sunday 19th June from 1400 to 2000 hours and from 0730 to 2100 hours Monday 20th June through Saturday 25th June.
- b) Prize Giving on 25th June is by Invitation Only. These will be issued by Government House not the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club and will be available at the Duty Desk once the results are finalized (estimate not BEFORE Thursday June 23rd). Skippers are advised that everyone **MUST** take their invitations and an **ID** along with them to the Prize Giving; otherwise they **WILL NOT BE ADMITTED. NO INVITATION, NO ENTRY.**

THERE WILL BE NO REPLACEMENT FOR LOST OR MISSING INVITATIONS AND THEY ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE. We are limited in the number of available invitations for the Prize Giving, therefore as a courtesy to other competitors, if you or your crew are unable to attend, please return the invitations to the Duty Desk at the RBYC.

- c) Participation plaques should be collected and signed for at the Duty Desk.

11. INFORMATION, MAIL AND SOUVENIRS

The Duty Officers in the Trophy Lounge will have facilities for receiving mail as well as handling telephone calls and inquiries. They will be present between 1400 to 2000 on Sunday 19th June and 0730 and 2100 hours daily from Monday 20th June to Saturday 25th June. There is a letter rack, specifically for yachts incoming mail and messages, on Commodore's Row off the main foyer. Event merchandise will be on sale at the Club in the Calabash Room.

12. RHADC TRANSPORT

There will not be a water shuttle service put in place to transport people between the Royal Hamilton Amateur Dingy Club and the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club. Competitors berthed at the RHADC should contact their Duty Desk for assistance with transportation to RBYC.

18. WATER, GASOLINE, PROPANE, ICE

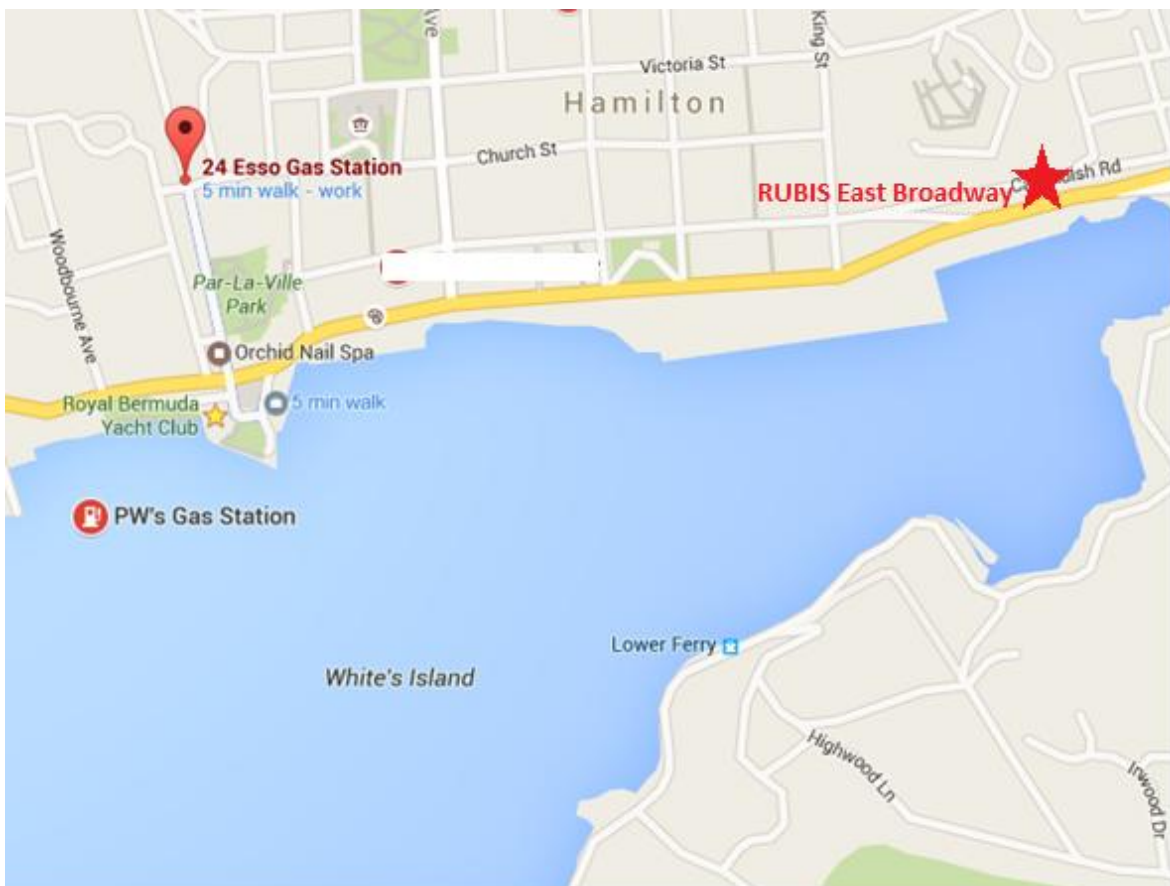
Fuel is available at the Pearman Watlington Marine Filling Station telephone 295-3185 just west of the RBYC marina. Note that the maximum draft at low tide is 10'. This

service station is open from 8:00am to 6:00pm Monday through Saturday and 8:00am to 5:00pm on Sunday. Bagged ice available. Fuel can be purchased by credit card 24/7.

For deeper water, fuel can be purchased by appointment at Rubis Dockyard where the maximum draft is 32'. Contact Ricky Powell at 234-0233.

Fuel is also available by appointment with Esso at Tiger Bay in St. George's. Contact Chris Gibbons at 294-523.

Propane refills are available from any Gas/Petrol station, the closest being Esso Tiger Mart at the top of Bermudian Road, a 5-minute walk from the RBYC or RUBIS East Broadway, which is a 5 minute drive by bike at the East End of Hamilton City (stay on Front Street to city limits).



Bermuda Gas is available for larger deliveries. Please contact Mr. Lightbourn at 325-1833 or 295-3111 Monday to Friday 8:00am to 4:00pm.

Water is available from various outlets along the RBYC dock and is included in the berth fee.

Electricity – shore power is 120v 30amp or 120/240v 50amp. **BOATS MUST PROVIDE THEIR OWN SHORE POWER LEADS PLUS ADAPTERS.**

Ice: **There will be a daily delivery of both block and bag ice from Monday, June 20th between the times of 10:00am and 11:00am and again between 3:00 and 4:00pm.**

28. BONDED LIQUOR

Bonded liquor should be ordered 24-48 hours prior to departure. Deliveries will be made directly to yachts moored at RBYC and are subject to Customs Regulations. **Under no circumstances must Bonded Liquor be left on RBYC premises.** Alcohol is not available for purchase on Sundays. **A Goslings' Duty free desk will be set up on the RBYC Terrace from Tuesday 21st June through Friday 24th June from 9am to noon.**

29. CREWS FOR RETURN VOYAGE

Check the Notice Board in the Trophy Lounge for a list of persons willing to act as crew on the returning to the US or Canada or check the website under the 2016 Race and Crew www.bermudarace.com

30. CLEARANCE FROM BERMUDA

All skippers **must** present their VESSEL CLEARANCE FORM (**YELLOW COPY**) to the Customs Officer at RBYC for outward clearance. It is required that immediately before departure from Bermuda, skippers provide a statement giving the name of the yacht, estimated time of departure, names, nationality and address of all people on board and proposed port of entry.

Once H.M. Customs Officers are no longer stationed at the RBYC, which will be after Sunday 26th June, skippers must clear out at the Yacht Reporting Centre, in St. George telephone 441-297-1226. Participants should advise H.M. Customs that they are Newport to Bermuda Race competitors.

Skippers of yachts returning to the US with any aliens on board should ensure that the aliens present themselves to the US Immigration Officer at the US Consulate, "Crown Hill", 16 Middle Road, Devonshire, telephone 441-295-1342, fax 441-295-1592 and if their passports are in order, they will be issued an immigration permit and clearance to enter the US. This will avoid embarrassment and unnecessary delay at the yacht's port of entry.

31. DEPARTURE FROM BERMUDA

Prior to departure from Bermuda, all yachts are required to notify Maritime Operations on VHF Channel 16, to give them a departure time, Persons On Board, and next port of call in the event of an incident after they leave. Skippers are recommended to call on the way up from Hamilton as you approach the Narrows Channel for sea.

32 MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1972

Importation of, possession of, or dealing with unlawful drugs (including marijuana) is an offence. Anyone contravening this Act is liable to fines of up to \$10,000 or 5 years' imprisonment or both. Conviction on indictment carries a maximum penalty of a fine or imprisonment for life, or both. This includes marijuana and other 'soft' drugs as well as 'hard' drugs. All medically prescribed drugs and medications MUST be declared to the H.M. Customs Officers.

33 FIREARMS ACT 1973

Under this Act, the importation of any firearm, part of a firearm, or ammunition into Bermuda is strictly forbidden except under the authority of a permit granted by the Commissioner of Police. Such a permit will not ordinarily be granted other than in exceptional circumstances. Spear guns and a variety of dangerous weapons are treated as firearms, such as Verey Flare Pistols and signal guns and no one can legally possess, purchase, or acquire or import such weapons in these islands. No spear fishing whatsoever is permitted within one mile of any shore. It is nonetheless normal that most non-commercial vessels entering Bermuda will have on board at the very least a Verey Flare Pistol or signal gun, or perhaps some other firearm. If this is the case, the Captain must immediately and voluntarily declare all firearms and ammunition to the H.M. Customs Officers as soon as he presents himself to the Officers. Depending on the circumstances, the Customs Officer will either detain all such firearms and ammunition and return them upon departure of the vessel; or he may decide merely to seal such weapons on board in some appropriate place; he would then check the seal upon departure to ensure it has not been broken.
